- New Business

a. DACA Resolution

MSU adopted their own DACA resolution but might make edits. A student at large was supposed to come to the MSU Denver SGA meeting to voice some concerns, but didn't end up coming. MSU Denver also plans on writing a letter to congress to urge them to pass the Dream Act. CCD hasn't released a resolution yet, but Ola believes that they plan to release some sort of resolution or statement.

Mayra proposed that the institutions should unite their resolutions, an idea Ariel agreed would have a greater impact than them being released separate of one another. However, to achieve this unity SGAs will need to be consulted further. Frida wanted to make sure that if SACAB wrote a resolution, they also had some sort of action plan.

Emily pulled up MSU's resolution, in it they declared that MSU stands with DACA and dreamers who feel oppressed, but they intentionally did not use the words "sanctuary campus" due to the potential of the institutions not being able to adequately uphold that statement (because the campus is partially federally funded). Frida proposed consulting with the SGA executives to get a better idea of everyone's goals and intentions.

Ariel recommended that they share the Sanctuary resolution that was passed by last year's SACAB group. Findings will be brought up next meeting and the group will discuss what they wish to incorporate into the collective resolution.

b. Schedule Monthly Outreaches

Frida proposed tabling monthly at various locations on campus to increase SACAB exposure. Bela offered to book locations. SACAB will use Fall Fest to spread awareness in September. On October 25th, tabling will occur between 12:00pm - 2:00pm and on November 29th also from 12:00-2:00pm.

Additionally, Frida shared that she would like to go to the Student Organization Council meetings to make sure that all the student orgs are feeling comfortable with the new pricing structure, and see if anyone had questions or concerns that they wanted to share with SACAB. The group agreed. They will plan to do this next month.

c. AHHA Update

Bela shared the current plans for AHHA week. She has begun to get a committee together for planning. She reserved the Turnhalle and St. Cajetan's for the event, which will take place 11/15 and 11/16. The committee will meet on Monday at noon in the SACAB office. They want to get more details nailed down, and a timeline, so they can stay organized and on top of this event. All SACAB members are encouraged to attend these meetings and take part in the planning process.
