

AURARIA SUSTAINABLE FOOD TRUCK GUIDELINES

1. The Auraria Campus is committed to being a leader in sound social and environmental practices. Food Trucks will be expected to participate in recycling and composting programs (where available) to divert waste from the landfill and local waterways.

Waste Diversion

- Recycle all paper, cardboard, plastic containers labeled 1-7, metal cans, glass bottles and jars and milk and juice cartons. Food trucks must provide clearly labeled bins for landfill/trash, plastic, metal, glass containers, and paper.
- Vendors will be expected to provide a “dine-in/no plastic bag” option for customers (where applicable) in order to minimize the use of plastic bags. Styrofoam containers are not permitted.
- Use recyclable or compostable service-ware and packaging when possible.
- When available, support composting and food waste diversion by offering appropriate packaging and signage.

Storm Water Management

- At the end of each food truck shift, the food truck operator must remove debris and food waste from surrounding paved and landscaped areas on campus.
 - Food trucks must prevent the disposal of any materials, including rinse-or-wash waters, any spilled materials, or any waste, into streets, gutters, storm drains, or creeks.
 - Vehicles and equipment must be free of leaking fluids.
2. Food trucks are not permitted to idle unless it is critical to the safe handling and storage of food.
 3. Each food truck must comply with and/or exceed applicable health codes and adhere to the best practices for neatness, cleanliness, and sanitation.
